Perfectly Matched Patchwork Pieces

With paper templates to guide you, successful patchwork projects are just stitches away!

- >> Choose your shapes, cut paper templates, and attach the templates to pieces of fabric.
- >> Fold fabric edges over the templates and secure the shape with simple basting stitches.
- >> Lay out the patches in desired arrangment and stitch the seams together along connecting edges.
- >> Remove the basting stitches, pull out the paper, and admire your handiwork!</
