At the end of each description of a given problem, there is a reminder of the correct behavior in a larger font ("Stanley, use the toilet!"). There isn't really a gross-out factor with this book-all of the behaviors and descriptions are appropriate for the audience. The funny situations will make for uproarious reading.
